

CLUB RULES & REGULATIONS

GENERAL

The Wyoming Golf Club exists for the enjoyment of its members. Members are encouraged to use the Club as much as they would like, enjoy the sports provided by the Club, and participate in all Club social and dining functions.

Rules and regulations are needed to enhance this experience and maximize use of our facilities. They also contribute to the safety of the members as well as extend the life of the Club's physical assets.

It is in this spirit that these rules and regulations are written. Our Club manager is authorized by the Board of Directors to enforce these rules and all members should cooperate with him as he does his job.

HOUSE RULES

1. The course will open at 7:30 a.m. Memorial Day through Labor Day weekend. At all other times the course will open at 8:00, but will vary depending on weather conditions.
2. The clubhouse will be closed for two weeks for maintenance and repairs beginning January 1.
3. Golf shoes with soft spikes are permitted in all areas of the clubhouse.
4. Private parties should be arranged through the Club Manager and Club Chef.
5. Parking is limited during the peak periods in May and June, and parking on the street in front of the Club is not permitted. Anyone not too inconvenienced by walking to the Club during these times is encouraged to do so.

6. There is no insurance available (except at a prohibitive cost) to the Club which will provide coverage in the event of loss due to fire, theft, etc., relating to personal effects or valuables of members or guests. This includes golf equipment stored in the Pro Shop. As a consequence, the Club assumes no responsibility in the event of such a loss occurring on Club premises.

DINING ROOM/19TH HOLE RULES

1. 19th Hole - Summer schedule only - Open daily except Mondays. Food service: Weekdays - 11:00 to 3:00; Saturdays & Holidays - 11:00 to 3:30; Sunday - 10:15 to 3:30. Winter schedule will be listed on monthly calendar. Beverage service: Drinks Available Upon Request At Any Time.

2. Members will be advised of Club dinner nights and special events through special flyers, e-mails, and the monthly calendar.

3. Dining room reservations are specifically requested at all times in order to assure good service.

4. During the swimming pool season, food service will also be available on the porch. A service charge will be assessed on all food and beverage purchases.

5. Bad behavior will not be tolerated at the club. Any one misbehaving will not be served. Young children must be supervised at all times.

6. Only when the kitchen is closed and no food service is available, food is permitted to be brought in.

GOLF COURSE RULES

1. The Club Professional shall be responsible for the control of play by all. This includes responsibility for speed of play, and practicing and playing at the proper time and in the proper place.
2. All players, regardless of age, must register in the Pro Shop before playing.
3. Unmarried sons and daughters of Regular and Senior Members, who are over 18 years old but less than 23 years old, may, upon payment of \$100.00 annually (plus tax, if any) enjoy the same privileges as a Regular member. Sons and daughters who are 23 or older and continuing with their education, may pay \$150 for club privileges; others must apply for Intermediate membership if they wish to use the Club facilities as other than their parents' guest.
4. Unmarried sons in the immediate household of Regular or Senior Members, who are 19 years old but less than 23 years old and who have not taken advantage of the privilege offered in Rule No. 3, may play only upon payment of the usual guest greens fees.
5. Foursomes are always preferred. Threesomes and twosomes are discouraged on Saturday and Sunday mornings. Fivesomes are allowed with the permission of the Golf Professional.
6. A slower group of players MUST permit a faster group to play through if there is a complete hole open in front of the slower group.
7. Starting on any hole except #1 is not permitted without the express approval of the Club Professional.

8. Practice shall be limited to the practice range, the practice green near the practice sand trap, and the putting green.

9. The safety of golfers on holes #2 and #4 must be of particular concern to those people hitting balls on the practice range. Do not hit long irons or woods if there are players in the area on hole #2 or #4. Do not hit any club if there are players in the practice range.

10. Hit only from designated areas on the driving range. Mats are to be used when specified.

11. Golf carts may be driven across fairways at right angles when the greens superintendent has determined that this is acceptable. Signs on all carts indicate when crossing fairways is acceptable and when it is not.

12. Proper attire should be worn at all times when using any of the golf course facilities. Short shorts, cutoffs, and jeans are not acceptable attire during the season. Jeans may be worn November thru March. Men shall wear shirts with collars; dress crew neck shirts are also acceptable.

13. The golf course and practice areas are closed to regular play on Monday.

GOLF COURSE GUEST PRIVILEGES

1. All members shall have the privilege of inviting guests, except that no guest who resides within 100 miles of the Club may play golf as a guest more than seven days in any one year.
2. Members must register their guests in the Pro Shop before starting.
3. All guests must be accompanied in their foursome by a playing member unless prior arrangements are made with the Golf Professional.
4. Member-sponsored groups and outings must have prior approval of the Board of Directors.
5. The following guest greens fees have been established by the Board of Directors and are subject to change yearly: From April 1- Nov. 15, the 18-hole fee is \$48.00 on weekdays, and \$58.00 on Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays. The 9-hole fee is \$25.00 on weekdays, \$30.00 on weekends and holidays. From November 16-March 31, the 9-hole guest fee is \$12.00; the 18-hole fee is \$20.00.
Cart fees are charged on a per person rate of: \$20.00 for 18 holes and \$12.00 for 9 holes.

HANDICAPS

1. Everyone who plays golf regularly should have a handicap. A handicap permits you to play in events both at our Club and at other clubs.
2. Handicaps must be fair. In order that they be fair, a score must be turned in for EVERY round. Scores should be properly adjusted before being posted. Scores should not be discarded because the golfer picked-up on a hole. The highest allowable score for the hole should be recorded, and the total score should be posted.
3. Scores posted from courses other than Wyoming must include the course and slope ratings.

PRO SHOP

1. The Pro Shop will be open at 7:30 a.m. from Memorial Day through Labor Day weekend. The Pro Shop closes at dusk. From October 1 through April 30 the Pro Shop hours will vary depending on weather conditions.
2. The Pro Shop is closed on Monday except when Monday is a holiday. When the course and Pro Shop are open on Monday, they are closed the following Tuesday.
3. The concession stand and bar is open whenever the Pro Shop is open.
4. The driving range will close at 7:30 p.m. from June 1 through August 20 unless otherwise posted. Other closing times will be noted monthly.
5. Private and group golf lessons are available by arrangement with the professional staff.
6. Three wheeled push carts, purchased from our pro shop, are permitted on the course.
7. Golf carts are available for rental on a first come basis.

CARE OF THE GOLF COURSE

1. In an effort to keep the golf course clean and presentable, please use the waste containers provided on every hole for all refuse.
2. Replace divots, fix ball marks on the greens and rake the sand traps. On par three holes use the sand provided to repair divots if the divot has been destroyed. Please try to replace your divot.
3. Pick up broken tees and put them in the waste containers or on the cart. Retrieve good tees and reuse them.

GOLF COURSE USE SCHEDULE

Monday- Course closed except after 3:30 juniors and Wyoming Police may play. The staff may play at times agreeable to Pro and Superintendent.

Tuesday- Women have preferential playing rights when a golf event is scheduled. Men wishing to play in the morning may call the Pro Shop to find out availability.

Wednesday- “Open play” all day except that women 9-Holers have preferential playing rights beginning at 8:45 and for all special events.

Thursday- Junior clinic and golf from 8:30 -11:00 (June-August). Juniors have preferential playing rights before 11:00.

Friday- “Open play”.

Saturday- Men and Women have playing privileges all day. Juniors after 2:00 or at discretion of Pro.

Sunday- Men and Women have playing privileges all day. After 2:00, juniors and juniors under 12 may play with permission of Club Professional.

SWIMMING POOL

POOL HOURS (Memorial Day through Labor Day)

Tuesday thru Sunday.....10.00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
and Holidays

Monday (except Holidays)12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

POOL GUEST FEES

Weekdays\$3.00 each per day

Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays\$4.00 each per day

Out of the County

House Guests\$10.00 each per week or
\$15.00 per family per week

It is the responsibility of the member to register their guests upon entering the pool.

POOL REGULATIONS

1. Only Club members and their guests are permitted to use the pool.
2. A resident of Hamilton County may use the pool as a guest not more than TWICE in any one month.
3. It is the responsibility of the sponsoring member to register guests upon entering the pool area.
4. Access to the pool area should be made from the East driveway. Use of the driveway in front on the #9 tee is permitted only with caution.
5. Swimmers may use the restrooms and showers in the Club's lockerrooms. Children under the age of 6 must be accompanied by an adult. Please dry off before entering.
6. Swimmers are not permitted in the Clubhouse, in the 19th Hole, or on the putting green if they are in bathing attire. Swimmers are permitted in the Clubhouse locker rooms only if they are dry and with cover-ups.
7. Children 8 years of age and under must be accompanied by an adult or an approved baby sitter at all times.
8. Children who have reached 9 years of age may swim unaccompanied by an adult with parents permission.
9. The life guards are employed to protect the lives of your children—not as babysitters.
10. Food may not be consumed in the pool area.
11. Cover-ups should be worn over bathing attire between the parking area and the pool, and in Clubhouse.
12. No running is permitted around the pool area.
- 13. DURING POOL HOURS, THE LIFE GUARD ON DUTY IS IN CHARGE OF THE POOL AND IS CHARGED WITH ENFORCING THE ABOVE RULES.**
